

## Due Process Timeline Information

	<b>14 calendar days</b> (if 14th day is a holiday or weekend, choose the first school day as 14th day)	<b>30 school days</b>	<b>about 10</b>	<b>Other noteworthy date guidelines:</b>
<b>ER</b>	* <u>Re-eval</u> : Used to determine when testing can begin. Start counting on day after the date of the Eval Plan/PWN document.	*to complete an eval. <u>Initial</u> start counting the day after the date permission is received by the district. <u>Reeval</u> start counting from 14th day or day after parent returned permission- whichever occurs first. If snow days or absences occur which are impacting completion date, document reason for extension.	NA	*date of the ER is the date of the meeting, no exceptions, even though you take a few days to finish and finalize
<b>IEP</b>	* start date of an IEP is 14 calendar days after date of PWN. No exceptions- even if parent signs earlier (or later on initial). The start date on the IEP always stays as that 14th day. Practice: write date received by hand on actual PWN.	NA	*from IEP meeting date to completing IEP (date of PWN) and sending home	*Meeting date to meeting date- rule for annual IEP meetings  *End date is one year from start date - - not the date of the meeting
